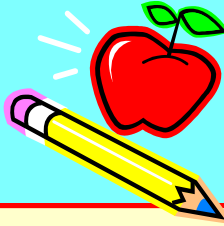

We notice the small steps authors use to create a picture, use precise words, and think about what literary (figurative) language really means, why authors end stories certain ways, and what lessons we can learn from our favorite series.
